REV. ROBERT SPITZER, SJ, PhD

Father Robert Spitzer was ordained a Catholic priest on June 11, 1983 and completed a Doctorate in Philosophy in 1988 at Catholic University of America. A world-renowned scholar, author and lecturer, Fr. Spitzer has served as President of Gonzaga University, founded seven major national institutes and produced seven television series for EWTN. Fr. Spitzer currently heads the Magis Institute, an organization dedicated to public education on the relationship among the disciplines of physics, philosophy, reason and faith, and the Spitzer Center of Ethical Leadership, which works with corporations, individuals and nonprofit organizations in the area of ethics education. His latest book, *Ten Universal Principles: A Brief Philosophy of the Life Issues*, considers the natural law principles upon which our society is built, how these principles are the foundation for sound reasoning, and how they guide our thoughts, actions, laws, and public policies.
