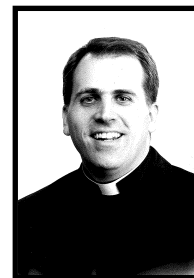
## THE AFTERMATH OF THE 1930 LAMBETH CONFERENCE

### REV. ERIC BERGMAN

Fr. Eric Bergman is a Catholic priest of the Diocese of Scranton, Pennsylvania. He serves in Scranton as the Chaplain of the St. Thomas More Society, a community of converts to Catholicism who have retained certain elements of their Anglican heritage, most notably in the celebration of the Anglican Use of the Roman Rite Mass. Formerly a clergyman of the Episcopal Church and a convert to Catholicism himself, Fr. Bergman was ordained to the priesthood in 2007 through the Pastoral Provision of Pope John Paul II. In addition Fr. Bergman serves as Chaplain of the Anglican Use Society, a Catholic organization dedicated to increasing awareness of the Pastoral Provision and now the 2009 Apostolic Constitution of Pope Benedict XVI, *Anglicanorum Coetibus*. His articles have been published in *Anglican Embers*, *This Rock*, and *Catholic Men's Quarterly*, and he has spoken across the United States about the work of the St. Thomas More Society.
