**Fr. Andrew Hofer, O.P.**

After growing up as the youngest of ten children on a farm in Kansas, Fr. Andrew Hofer studied history, philosophy, and classics at Benedictine College. He then went to St. Andrews, Scotland for a Master of Letters in medieval history. Fr. Andrew entered the Order of Preachers as a son of the Province of St. Joseph, and was ordained a priest in 2002. After finishing his S.T.L. and serving as an associate pastor for a brief time, he was sent to Kenya as a missionary for two years. He taught at the Tangaza College of The Catholic University of Eastern Africa and at other institutions in Nairobi. He returned to the U.S. and completed his Ph.D. in theology at the University of Notre Dame, with the primary area of history of Christianity (specializing in patristic theology with additional studies in medieval theology) and the secondary area of systematic theology. His research appears in such journals as *Vigiliae Christianae*, *Augustinianum*, *New Blackfriars*, *Nova et Vetera*, *Downside Review*, *Pro Ecclesia*, *The Thomist*, *Communio*, and *Angelicum*. Fr. Andrew Hofer currently resides at the Pontifical Faculty of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, D.C., where he teaches patristics and ancient languages.
