Dr Daniel G. Van Slyke is Associate Professor of Church History at Kenrick-Glennon Seminary in the Archdiocese of St Louis. He holds an M.A. in theology from the University of Dallas, an S.T.L. in theology from the University of St. Mary of the Lake, and a Ph.D. in historical theology from Saint Louis University. With special interests in ancient Church history and Christian worship, Dr Van Slyke has lectured widely and published articles in various venues, including *Adoremus*, *Ephemerides Liturgicae*, *The Homiletic and Pastoral Review*, *The Josephinum Journal of Theology*, *The New Catholic Encyclopedia*, and *Usus Antiquior*. His book, *Liturgy 101: Sacraments and Sacramentals*, was released by Ligouri Publications in 2010. Dr Van Slyke and his wife Laura have seven children.
